



Voucher parents - below are the voucher requirements. After you register provide the following below:

1. Residency Requirements

- Documentation must be between November 23, 2023-April 19, 2024
- Must be given to the school office now until April 15, 2024
- The address must be the same as what is written on the application abbreviations, etc.
- P.O. Box address are NOT accepted
- Parent(s) or guardian(s) first and last name must agree with the application.
- The residency documentation MUST be one of the accepted documents listed on the DPI website.
- W-2 year-end earnings statements are unacceptable for applications received after April.
- Examples of documentation that is NOT acceptable for residency:
 - IRS 1040 forms
 - Cell phone bills
 - Internet bills
 - Recycling bills
 - Bank Statements
 - Envelopes (must see the actual bill or letter)
 - Mortgage statements

Income Statement Requirements (if parents did not use the DOR method):

State tax returns are not acceptable (only 1040's or other income acceptable documentation)
