Welcome to the House of the Lord

We like to remember our loved ones who are now with the Lord. Welcome to All Saints Day worship. Centuries ago, Christians determined it was a helpful and honorable thing to do. Specific days in each month are marked for the remembering of Christians (saints) who have gone before us, especially those whose lives the Lord used in more remarkable ways, people from the Bible like Luke and Paul, servants like John of Chrysostom and Basil from the 4th century, and Martin Luther from Reformation times. First, we thank God for strengthening our trust as we see the mercy He extended to His saints of old, for although their faithfulness is noted, they too were sinful and in need of God's mercy. Second, we thank God for the faithful from of old, because in witnessing their faithfulness, God builds courage in us to imitate them according to our calling in life.

Our custom at St. Paul is to read the names of those from our own families and congregation whom the Lord has taken from our earthly presence to His nearer presence in Christ, and we do so again this All Saints Day.

Note for those desiring to commune... Our practice of close communion is the Biblical and historic practice of the Christian church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for His people since it seeks to prevent spiritual damage to those who do not recognize the true body and blood of Christ in, with, and under the bread and wine in this Holy Supper (1 Corinthians 11:29). Furthermore, it does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Romans 16:17) and the Bible's witness that the Lord's Supper is the highest expression of fellowship and doctrinal unity (Acts 2:42). For this reason, guests who are not a member of a sister LCMS congregation are asked to speak to our pastor before communing.
