Welcome to the House of the Lord

Missions — the word relates to the telling and proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ to people who are not Christian. The message is, He saves us from death and hell by His grace through the gift of faith. Without Christ, a person is damned eternally. With Christ, through Him, a person is saved, given everlasting life in paradise. The word *missions* is closely associated with the word *evangelism*. *Evangelism* means “messenger of good news.”

Missionary — We use the word most often to refer to a pastor who has been trained and *called* to serve in a mission field. Our congregation supports Pastor Vanko who serves in Romania, and Pastor Naumann, who is a *called* missionary responsible for theological education in Sri Lanka, training natives to become pastors. We also support Viola Fronkova, our dear friend in Slovakia, who is our interpreter for Pastor Vanko, and who has devoted her life to evangelism, to reaching the lost in Slovakia. Most recently, she is completing a second volume, a book telling the stories of pastors who were persecuted under communism.

Today — We welcome to St. Paul Pastor Edward Naumann and his wife Monica and their five children, plus one due to be born in October! Pastor Naumann has been visiting congregations in the Midwest during these summer weeks that are supportive of the ministry in Sri Lanka. Please welcome the Naumanns to St. Paul, to Bonduel, and assure them of your prayers and love.
