Luke 2:10–14

St. Paul School Forest . . . A year ago, St. Paul was scheduled to have the St. Paul School Forest logged to keep the forest healthy. It did not happen last year due to a wet fall which did not provide a solid base to run heavy equipment across. We have been in contact with the contracted logger and he will begin work in the next few weeks. If you see heavy equipment in the parking lot by the cemetery, it will be the logging crew. Please stay away from the equipment and out of the school forest until the equipment is gone.

Assistance Needed . . . You may or may not be aware of the St. Paul Care-Share ministry from which our congregation tries to give assistance to people in need as Jesus asks us to do in Scripture. Currently there are two individuals who are seeking help, one who recently moved into the area and is looking for a double box spring and mattress along with a microwave oven for an apartment. The second individual is someone originally from the Bonduel area and, with stage 2 cancer, unable to make payments on his rent. He has been thoroughly vetted and the landlord contacted. If anyone is willing to help this person through rental assistance (the applications for government help are "stalled") please contact the church office at 715–758–8559.

St. Paul Lutheran School is recommended for NLSA Accreditation

The National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA) is a self-study process developed by the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod for schools to work through to verify the quality of the operations at the school. As part of a school having NLSA accreditation, the school will have a five-year plan for improvement.

St. Paul Lutheran School currently holds this accreditation. After five years, the school needs to work through the self-study again to assure the quality of our educational process. A year ago, we were working through the self-study, planning to have a verifying team visit St. Paul to verify the self-study report, and then recommend St. Paul for continued accreditation status. The verifying team was scheduled for April of 2020. Due to Covid-19, the verifying team did not visit us until November 2nd & 3rd of 2020. The visiting team, after verifying the self-study report from St. Paul, approved and is recommending that we continue to hold our accreditation status. Final approval will be confirmed during the month of August 2021.

This was a huge undertaking, and I would like to thank the teachers, steering committee (who were the leaders in the self-study) and the Board of Christian Education for their hours of time needed to complete this process. Watch in August for the final step to the accreditation process. This will be when we will receive accreditation status for the next five years. *Mr. Gerald R. Schmidt, Principal*
