Holy Communion . . . Our practice of close communion is the Biblical and historic practice of the Christian church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for His people since it seeks to prevent spiritual damage to those who do not recognize the true body and blood of Christ in, with, and under the bread and wine in this Holy Supper (1 Cor. 11:29). St. Paul School Forest . . . A year ago, St. Paul was scheduled to have the St. Paul School Forest logged to keep the forest healthy. It did not happen last year due to a wet fall which did not provide a solid base to run heavy equipment across. We have been in contact with the contracted logger and he will begin work in the next few weeks. If you see heavy equipment in the parking lot by the cemetery, it will be the logging crew. Please stay away from the equipment and out of the school forest until the equipment is gone.

Assistance Needed . . . You may or may not be aware of the St. Paul Care-Share ministry from which our congregation tries to give assistance to people in need as Jesus asks us to do in Scripture. Currently there are two individuals who are seeking help, one who recently moved into the area and is looking for a double box spring and mattress along with a microwave oven for an apartment. The second individual is someone originally from the Bonduel area and, with stage 2 cancer, unable to make payments on his rent. He has been thoroughly vetted and the landlord contacted.
