## The Word of the Lord

### Isaiah 6:1–3

<sup>1</sup>In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. <sup>2</sup>Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. <sup>3</sup>And one called to another and said:

**“Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts;  
the whole earth is full of his glory!”**

### Revelation 4

<sup>1</sup>After this I looked, and behold, a door standing open in heaven! **Holy Communion . . .** Our practice of close communion is the Biblical and historic practice of the Christian church. For this reason, guests who are not members of a sister LCMS congregation are asked to speak to our pastor before communing.

## **Financial Update**

2020 was a challenging year due to the pandemic and the many changes to our daily lives. While weekly offerings were impacted initially, after a short period of adjustment offerings recovered and are currently on track with the budget.

Expenses have been down somewhat as the pandemic has limited the ability to continue some of the typical on-site activities held at the church and the school. However, technology was one area where additional spending was necessary as the church and school staff has worked to meet increased needs for remote access and programming.

This past spring St. Paul also received financial relief in the form of a CARES Act loan designated to cover salaries during the lockdown period. This funding allowed the church and school to continue paying all workers during the shutdown. The loan is forgivable, meaning it does not need to be paid back to the government.

Due both to the diligence and commitment of the staff and to the generosity of the congregation, St. Paul has been able to weather the challenges of recent months. While we have not yet returned to “business as usual”, we’re thankful for our many blessings as we navigate through the current climate.
