

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-fourth chapter.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. ²And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. ⁵And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? ⁶He is not here, but has risen. Note for those desiring to commune...

In the Lord's Supper, we receive the crucified and risen body and blood of the Lord Jesus with the bread and wine. This is not a symbolic rite. It is a real, miraculous eating and drinking of Christ's body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins, for strength for this life, and for the assurance of everlasting life with Him. It is a precious gift from the Lord, a means of grace.

However, the Bible also teaches that it is possible to receive the Lord's Supper to one's harm if they do not believe our Lord's teaching, have not been so taught, or are not repentant. Out of love for you and for God's Word, we kindly ask that if you are a guest today and not a member of an LCMS congregation, please speak to a pastor before communing.


