REPORT OF STORAGE FACILITIES COMMITTEE MEETING-OCT. 24, 2022

The committee met to determine if our present storage buildings (the space next to the outdoor classroom and the building across the street north of the school) are suitable for the needs of the congregation, the locations of the buildings are the best for those who most frequently use them, the future needs of the congregation would be met by the existing buildings, and to discuss whether there is adequate security in the existing buildings.

Presently there is lawn care equipment with multiple gasoline containers stored in both facilities. According to insurance advice it may not be “illegal” for gasoline containers to be stored in either building, but it is not “advisable” to store flammable materials where there is possibility of fumes being a health hazard or combustion issue.

The committee found that while the sizes of the storage facilities are large enough to meet our needs, it is not advisable to continue to store lawn care equipment and gasoline in the same confines as either an education building or one with multiple-use storage. The ability of many people to access the contents of the large building is a concern along with the condition of the doors. Since the large building has become an area used by several groups – wreath sale, 4th of July float building, storing bikes for Bike-Give-Away, storage for chairs and tables, storage for grills used by Men’s Club – security of the contents is questionable. The parties using the lawn equipment the majority of the time would find it most convenient if the equipment was stored near the cemetery.

The committee has recommended to proceed with the erection of the 20’ x 24’ storage shed previously approved by the St. Paul Voters’ Assembly, and that the location would be on the site of the previous structure since demolished.

Further, it is recommended that the trustees identify all the materials they would deem usable and move them to one confined area of the large storage building, designate areas for specific items of storage (ex. old folding chairs and tables), use some of the materials for shelving storage, and ensure the doors and locks on the large building are secure.

The congregation will advertise a “Free Day” next spring at which congregation members may take items they want in their present condition. Anything remaining would be disposed of or recycled.

The annual Lay Leader Training event . . . for pastors and congregational lay leaders who serve on ministry boards, is scheduled for Tuesday, January 17, 2023, at St. Paul from 6:00pm–8:00pm. Attendees will learn best practices and be better equipped to address the issues that arise in congregational ministry. NWD President Dwayne Lueck and his staff will cover strategy, finances, policy, and servant leadership.
